When do I take the test?

The ACT is usually offered six times during a school year. Students generally take the test during their junior year or during the fall of their senior year.

My ACT Test Date:

The SAT is administered every October, November, December, February, March, May and June of each school year. Most students take the SAT during the second semester of their junior year of the first semester of their senior year.

My SAT Test Date:

When and how do I register?

A registration packet should be available at your high school, but you may also register online at www.actstudent.org. Be mindful of registration dates as they are generally one month in advance, but it is suggested that you register at least six weeks prior to the test.

My ACT Registration Deadline:

How much does it cost?

Fee waivers are available for students who qualify for financial assistance, so inquire with the ACT directly.

What is the test's structure?

The ACT consists of 4 multiple-choice tests in English, math, reading, and science as well as an optional writing test.

The SAT has 10 sections that consist of critical reading, math, writing and one experimental.

How is the test scored?

There are a total of 4 tests that are composite scored between 1 and 36. Your final score is the average composite score of all 4 tests.

Scores on each section range from 200 to 800 points. The scores from each section are combined, and the highest possible combined score is 2400.
